During Commissioner Brown's employment with the Section of Environment, Energy, and Resources with the American Bar Association, she developed a keen interest in environmental law, resources, and the Clean Water Act.

In 2018, Commissioner Brown's family was heavily impacted when her son contracted an environmental illness that nearly took his life. He has since fully recovered, but the idea that this could happen to someone else's family has ignited a fire in her to protect her son and other children and families. This personal experience and her work in the non-profit sector have sparked her desire to give back to underserved and marginalized communities.

Commissioner Brown understands firsthand how vital clean water and air are to our communities, and her goal is to fight for equitable and healthy communities across Cook County. She is committed to fighting for residents in every corner of Cook County because the issues vary from one end to the next, and representation is critical.
