Your BUD request for composted biosolids has been approved in accordance with Section 22.54 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (Act) and the material processed at MWRD HASMA and MWRD CALSMA is not a waste when received at MWRD Chicago, 100 E. Erie St., Chicago, Illinois 60611 when generated, processed, and managed according to the following conditions:

This BUD approves and authorizes MWRD Chicago to place composted biosolids, a mixture of MWRD Chicago biosolids, landscape waste, and papermill sludge that has been successfully composted in accordance with Supplemental Permit Nos. 2021-403-SP and 2021-440-SP, at various locations throughout the State of Illinois.

1. Approval is only for composted biosolids as specifically identified and described in your application Log No. BUD21-001.

Approval does not apply to circumstances where the source of the material, method of generation, characteristics of the material, location or methods of use of the material vary from the information in the conditions of this letter or your approved application. If the information changes from that described in the application Log No. BUD21-001, the beneficial reuse activity shall cease until a new beneficial use determination from the Illinois EPA or a written determination that a new BUD is not required is received from the Illinois EPA. If changes occur which modify any of the information used in obtaining this authorization, the applicant of record shall notify the Illinois EPA. Such changes include, but are not limited to, the site where the material is used.

- 2. The compost biosolids shall only be used in a manner that is protective of human health, safety, and the environment and in compliance with applicable state and federal law. It should be noted that issuance of this authorization does not relieve the applicant of the responsibility of complying with the provisions of the State of Illinois Rule and Regulations, 35 Illinois Administrative Code (35 Ill. Adm. Code), Subtitle B, Air Pollution Control, Chapter 1.
- 3. This authorization shall terminate under operation of law if, due to a change in law, it conflicts with the law; however, the recipient of the determination may apply for a new beneficial use determination that is consistent with the law as amended within 30 days from the date the new law became effective.
- 4. This authorization does not allow use of hazardous waste, coal combustion waste, coal combustion by-product, sludge applied to the land, potentially infectious medical waste, used oil or compost waste.
- 5. This authorization does not apply to material that is burned for energy recovery, that is used to produce a fuel, or that is otherwise contained in a fuel.
- 6. This authorization is issued with the expressed understanding that no process discharge to Waters of the State, storm water runoff, or to a sanitary sewer will occur from these facilities except as authorized by a permit from the Illinois EPA Bureau of Water.

- 7. This authorization is issued with the expressed understanding that no air emissions will be generated from the site except as authorized by a permit from the Illinois EPA Bureau of Air.
- 8. This authorization is subject to review and modification by the Illinois EPA as deemed necessary to fulfill the intent and purpose of The Act, and all applicable environmental rules and regulations.
- 9. Any application for renewal of this BUD shall include the beneficial use application form LPC-PA27 and supporting documents with original signatures and seal to be filed with the Illinois EPA at least 180 days prior to the expiration date of this authorization.
- 10. MWRD Chicago and all sources of compost biosolids shall retain copies of all operating records, including any affidavits, records of retention times, training records, daily reports, inspection reports, incident reports, material profile identification sheets, recertifications, certifications of representative samples, laboratory analyses, special analysis plans, any waiver of requirements at the office of the facility for five years after this authorization expires. These records shall be made available to the Illinois EPA or their designee through intergovernmental agreement upon request.

Appeal Rights

The applicant may appeal this final decision to the Illinois Pollution Control Board pursuant to Section 40 of the Act by filing a petition for a hearing within 35 days after the date of issuance of the final decision. However, the 35-day period may be extended for a period of time not to exceed 90 days by written notice from the applicant and the Illinois EPA within the initial 35-day appeal period. If the owner or operator wishes to receive a 90-day extension, a written request that includes a statement of the date the final decision was received, along with a copy of this decision, must be sent to the Illinois EPA as soon as possible.
